From the Pastor

One of the first things Shannon and I "binge watched" on Prime Video was Downton Abbey. This television series was on PBS and depicted an English estate and the Grantham family in and around World War 1. As the show unfolds the family goes through changes, the largest is societal. They are a family of privilege, and after the Great War things change; the economy is not what it was before the war. Many people could no longer afford all of their servants, there are even family that had to give up their country homes! Life changes for them all. The industrial revolution is said to cause the First World War, the shift was on, from English aristocracy to a more industrial, more labor driven society.

I believe that we are living the next transformation of modern society. As we look around Alliance, Lordstown, and Canton we see these once great industrial cities struggling, leaving empty factories that once housed our father's and grandfather's eight hours a day, 5 to 6 days a week. Today jobs are less about loyalty to a company and more about doing what makes you happy or fulfilled.

There are people in this congregation that have been here all of their life, many who worked at the same job for more than 30 years and that is wonderful. The problem is that it is not the world we live in today. The world has changed and we, the church, have to change with it. Some people get upset when the pastor talks about change because "Jesus is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) Jesus is the same and I do not propose that we change Jesus; my hope is that we can work to bring the message of Jesus in a fresh new way to the everchanging world we live in.

On the second and fourth Wednesday's of the month we see this happening with the kids CAMPP and the Food Pantry. Luanne teaches with a passion for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. She mixes music and scripture, fun and function, theology and tradition; all of this with a group of people who cannot read. At 4:00PM Bethel opens its doors to people in need and we provide food to the people who enter our doors. We probably don't consider these folks a part of the congregation because we don't see them on Sundays, but this church and its people have become their family. Becoming a part of the lives of people who do not attend our Sunday services can be a great challenge but we have a great start; this is how we bring the message of Christ to a different world.

These two points of ministry are the places we need to build on as we look at the church moving forward. How can we adapt to be a greater part of the lives of the people that come to Bethel for something other than Sunday worship?

What's Happening at Bethel?




On October 27th at 5-7 p.m. We will be celebrating our harvest season by decorating vehicles, giving out candy and playing games.
